

This grid contains different activities linked to the Key Stage 1 curriculum that you can do with your child at home to support their learning. Please encourage your child to be as independent as possible with their work, including drawings and writing which they have done themselves. There are enough activities for the term. The homework books are to stay in your child's bag. If your child would like to create a different piece of work that is not an activity on the grid, this can also be done in your child's homework folder. As this homework is optional it will not be marked however it will be celebrated with the class.

English	1.Can you write a review about a book you have read in school or at home? – write about the book. What happened in it? Did you enjoy it? Would you recommend it to someone else? 2.Can you write a short story with lots of adjectives?	Can you act out a story you have read?

Music	Listen to any piece of music – can you write down the instruments you can hear?	Learn lyrics to songs for the upcoming Chobham Prom. Practice nativity songs. Can you practice the actions to the song? Can you clap the rhythm to any songs?
Art/DT	Painting self portraits in school so could you paint a picture of someone in your family using a variety of mediums – water colour.	Can you make a face out of old cardboard?
Science	Can you make a poster about what it means to be a scientist?	Be a scientist at home – create your own potion – take pictures and write captions.
Geography/ History	Can you find out facts about famous historical figures? – write them down!	Make a poster about something that's important to you.
